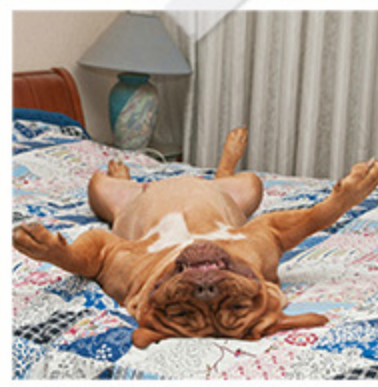
Warm Summer Greetings!

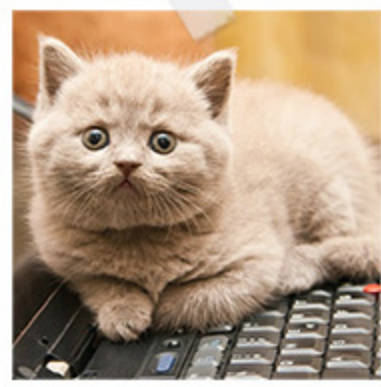


Summer: A Good Time for Pets to be Homebodies!

Bang! Fear of Fireworks



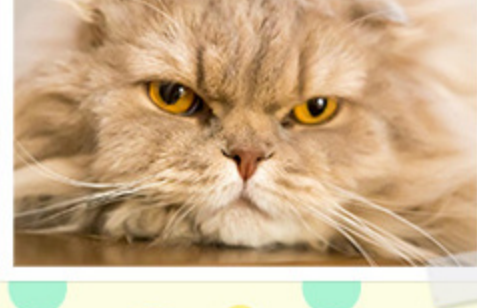
